

## Supplemental Materials Instructions

### \*Supplemental Files\*

*Leonardo/LMJ* authors may submit supplemental files to be linked to their articles online. Access is made available to subscribers on the MIT Press Journal's website.

### \*Number of Files\*

Each author can have up to 3 supplemental files—audio, video, images, or additional text.

### \*File Size\*

Each supplemental file has a maximum allowable file size of 100MB. Large files that take a long time to upload or to open are discouraged.

### \*File Format\*

Files must be in formats that are easily accessible by general web visitors, such as .mp3, .jpg, .rtf, .pdf, .mpg.

### \*File Preparation\*

Please upload your supplemental files to Dropbox and provide file access to the Leonardo editors. If Dropbox is not a suitable option for you, please let the editors know as soon as possible and we will make other arrangements.

For each supplemental file (e.g. MP3, JPG) that will appear on the MIT Press website, you should upload 2 files: (1) the supplemental file itself; and (2) an informational Word (.doc) or .txt file that includes the following information:

- 4) File size:
- 5) Caption (limit captions to 50 words):
- 6) Copyright credit:
